menstrual hygiene initiative (MHI)

Our educational initiative aims to improve the health care of women and girls in Banishanta, Bangladesh, through the sustainable supply of menstrual hygiene products and the dissemination of basic knowledge about menstrual hygiene.

Workshop on menstrual hygiene education as part of our Menstrual Hygiene Initiative



For this purpose a production facility with sewing machines for the production of inexpensive, reusable sanitary towels has been set up and seamstresses were trained for the production of fabric sanitary towels. In addition, educational workshops and training courses were held to inform schoolgirls about the use of the sanitary pads.



covid-19 prevention initiative (CPI)

As a preventive measure against the spread of the COVID-19 virus in Dacope, Bangladesh, we have launched this initiative for the production of facemasks

During the Covid-19 pandemic, trained seamstresses produced masks in the sewing facility built as part of the MHI. Along with soaps and educational leaflets, these facemasks were distributed free of charge to people of the vulnerable population groups in the slums of Dacopes.

JAGORAN

The aim of our latest project is to restructure a girls college in Bajua, Bangladesh - with innovative water and waste systems and new washrooms. In addition, we would like to provide education on menstrual hygiene and ensure the supply of sanitary pads for the girls.

JAGORAN thus combines the experience we have gained in our previous activities. In addition, the project is to be carried out with the involvement of the girls living there in order to give them the opportunity to participate in shaping the project.
